



Route 1 has big, rocky roads with a few great uphills, while the downhills are challenging and need to be approached with care.

Stunning views of Long Tom Pass can be seen from the turning point on Sable Road.

Route 2's large roads are rocky and fun to negotiate. Uphills and downhills make for a challenging, but enjoyable route, with lovely vistas of the untainted natural scenery.

The downhills are steep and demand utmost care and attention.

This route also boasts large, rocky roads with excellent uphills and steep downhills. At the point at which cyclists turn around on Sable Road, there are truly breath-taking views of Long Tom Pass.
